

Corporate programs for local development

For the development of the Responsible Action of the year 2022, the Responsible Action Model was continued on three pillars, on which the priority activities in terms of sustainability are framed. Its implementation is the responsibility of the Communications, Marketing and Social Responsibility Management team, specifically, through the Responsible Action Group. The three pillars that constitute it are: 1) Social Management, 2) Work Cells and 3) Flagship Program.

Flagship Program

Flagship program that maximizes the impact on the priority stakeholders, Community and Customers Territorial Entities categories 4, 5 and 6. Said program is directly connected with the following Findeter strategic objectives:

- Promote the generation of economic, social, and environmental impact of our management,
- Expand and diversify the base of impacted municipalities,
- Ensure effective structuring of projects, and
- Incorporate and strengthen best practices for corporate sustainability with stakeholders.

For the period corresponding to the 2019-2022 Strategic Plan, it was determined that the Program will be made up of two articulated subprograms, with the corporate purpose and mission of FINDETER:

a. Works for a Great Country

The first stage consists of the execution of small equipment interventions based on social architecture concepts that encourage and strengthen community dynamics in the works planned, structured, financed or executed by Findeter, thereby promoting the development of the communities with which we have a relationship.

"Works for a Great Country", began in the second semester of 2020, defining recreation oriented to the Community and Territorial Entity interest group, specifically the child population, as the line of intervention for the year 2022.

Through contract 0151 of December 30, 2021, the supply and installation of 6 children's-type trampolines was carried out for educational institutions located in the municipality of Jamundí, department of Valle del Cauca.

In the months of January and February 2022, and for a value of COP \$18 millions, this AOC was executed, benefiting the students of the following educational centers:

Through contract 0024 of May 17, 2022, the supply and installation of a playground was carried out for the Educational Institution Alfredo Bonilla Montaña, Terranova headquarters in the municipality of Jamundí, department of Valle del Cauca.

Between the months of May and July 2022, and for a value of COP \$127 millions this AOC was executed, benefiting 1,480 students from the Terranova educational center.

b. Projects that Transform

Findeter assumed the commitment to accompany the structuring of social infrastructure projects in category 4, 5 and 6 municipalities in the water and sanitation, energy, education, health and productive urban infrastructure sectors, as part of local development actions: This projects are partially financed with resources from an internally constituted Social Responsibility Fund.

During 2022, work was done on the structuring of the following projects: the recovery of public space and the navigability of the Caño Puerto Waffe in Turbo, Antioquia and the structuring projects for the modernization of electric lighting in the municipalities of Planadas and Rioblanco del Tolima.

At the end of 2022 and the beginning of 2023, the Social Responsibility Fund was restructured, seeking to reach a bigger number of municipalities in more flexible ways.
